**SECTION 4 : FIRST AID MEASURES**

As a general rule, in case of doubt or if symptoms persist, always call a doctor.

**4.1. Description of first aid measures**

**In the event of exposure by inhalation :**

Bring to the fresh air.

Consult a physician in case of disorder.

**In the event of splashes or contact with eyes :**

Wash thoroughly with fresh, clean water for 15 minutes holding the eyelids open.

If there is any pain, redness or visual impairment, consult an ophthalmologist.

**In the event of splashes or contact with skin :**

Remove clothing impregnated and carefully wash the skin with water and of the soap for 10 or 15 minutes.

Consult a doctor in the event of irritation.

**In the event of swallowing :**

Do not give the patient anything orally.

Seek medical attention, showing the label.

If swallowed accidentally, call a doctor to ascertain whether observation and hospital care will be necessary. Show the label.

If swallowed accidentally, do not allow to drink, do not induce vomiting and transfer to hospital immediately by ambulance. Show the label to the doctor.
