# **SECTION 4 : FIRST AID MEASURES**

As a general rule, in case of doubt or if symptoms persist, always call a doctor.

### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

#### In the event of exposure by inhalation :

# SECTION 6 : ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### 6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

#### For non first aid worker

### **SECTION 7 : HANDLING AND STORAGE**

#### 8.2. Exposure controls
